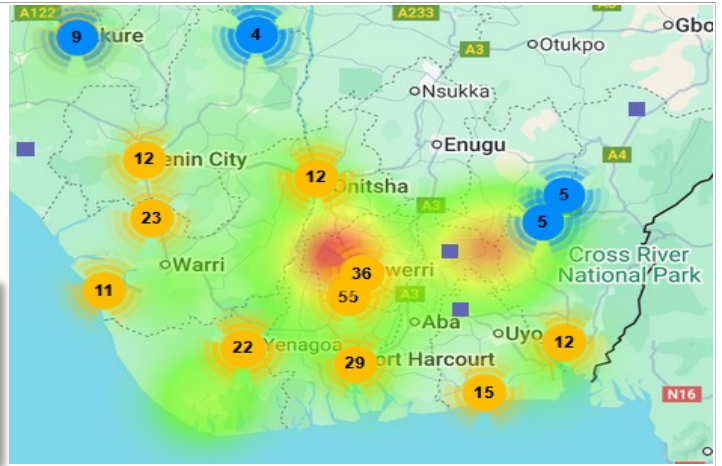


Niger Delta Weekly Conflict Update

October 26 - November 01, 2025

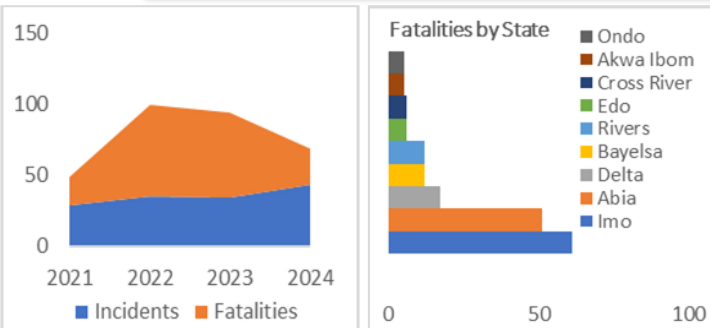
This update emphasizes the urgent need to strengthen oversight and accountability in security operations across the Niger Delta. Recurring reports of alleged misconduct, including extrajudicial actions and extortion, reveal governance and operational gaps within the security sector that undermine public trust and threaten regional stability.

Anticipated Trends and Dynamics

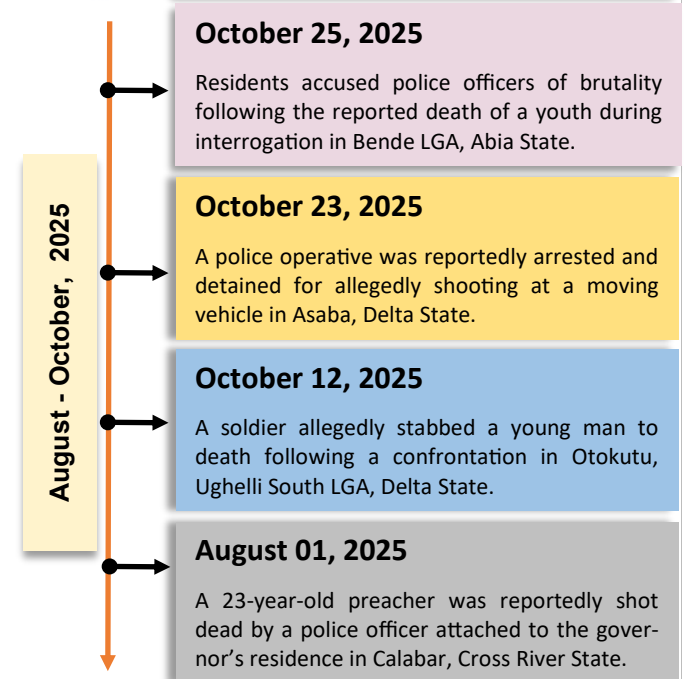
As security forces intensify operations against criminality, allegations of human rights violations are likely to rise, deepening mistrust between communities and security agencies. Without stronger oversight, tensions could escalate, undermining peace and stability.

Actions Taken to Manage the Situation

Law enforcement authorities have reportedly sanctioned officers implicated in rights violations. However, sustained oversight and commitment to human rights-based policing are essential to rebuild public trust and confidence in state institutions across the region.
