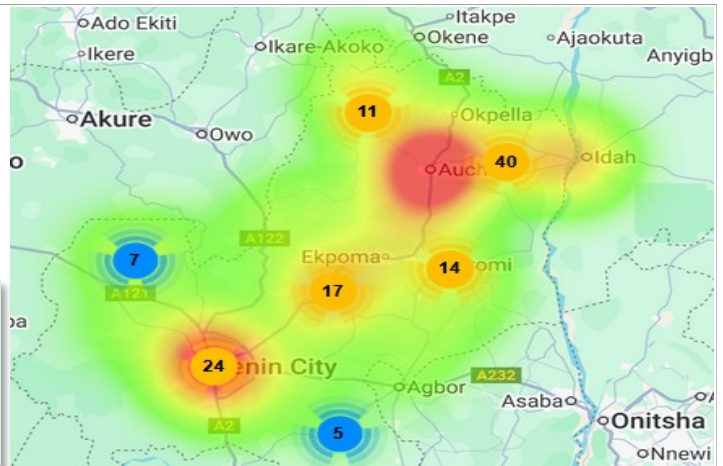
Preventing the Resurgence of Kidnapping and Armed Violence in Edo State

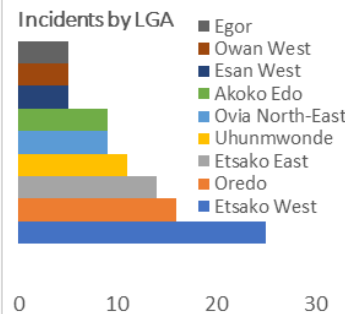
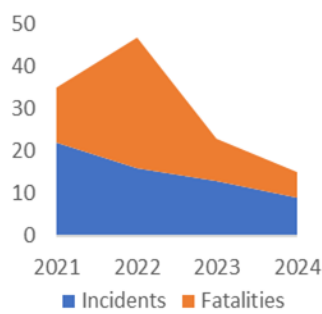

Anticipated Trends and Dynamics

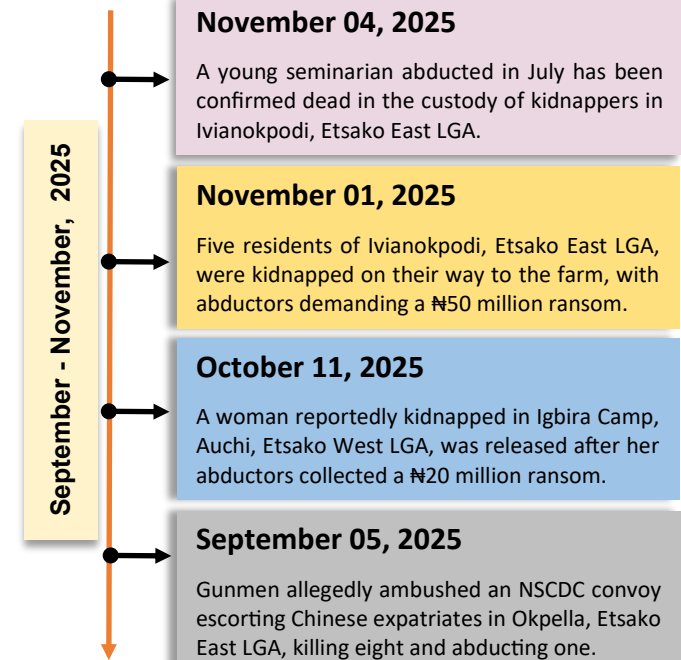
The recent resurgence of criminal violence and targeted attacks is intensifying fear among residents and undermining trust in security institutions. If not addressed, the situation could escalate and disrupt local economic activities and fuel further insecurity across the State.

Actions Taken to Mitigate the Situation

Security agencies have intensified patrols and rescue operations, while peace actors and community leaders work with law enforcement to strengthen intelligence and improve response. However, lasting peace requires addressing the root causes of the violence.
